## From the Tee Box



The Feast of the Holy Trinity  
May 17th and 18th, 2008

Dear Friends:

While we have returned to the season of Ordinary Time and the color green, this Sunday and next Sunday we celebrate 2 important feasts: that of the *Holy Trinity* and the *Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ* (sometimes commonly referred to as the "*Feast of Corpus Christi.*") The color for these 2 feasts is white. Beginning the first weekend of June the color for Sundays will be green. Finding the *extraordinary* in the *ordinary* is our invitation from the Lord and our challenge. As we celebrate the life-giving mysteries of God as 3 persons and the gift of eucharist, this time of year can also be an opportunity for us to renew our belief in the promise that God's grace is revealed to us and given to us in the everyday moments of ordinary daily living. Throughout his letters, Saint Paul reminds us that when we embrace the imperfections in life, then grace is uncovered in a new way, whether it be: busyness, suffering, disappointments, and other experiences when life surprisingly goes in a direction other than the one we anticipated. The beautiful reality of the mystery of God as 3 persons is that the same God who created the universe has also revealed Himself to us in Jesus and remains forever with us in the Holy Spirit and in sacrament. As we are aware of the Lord's presence with us when we gather in church on the weekends, may God increase our awareness of His presence in the everyday ordinary moments of life.

## THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

### Mystery Solved?

The scriptures for this feast give us important clues to help us grasp, if not solve, the mystery of God. In the reading from Exodus God's name is revealed to Moses. God is "the LORD, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity" (Exodus 34:6). Thus, unimaginable as it may be, the Lord of the whole universe cares intimately for humanity and treats us always with merciful love. In fact, the Gospel tells us that God "so loved the world that he gave his only Son" that we "might have eternal life" (John 3:16). And that is not the end of God's loving-kindness. The reading from Second Corinthians reminds us that "the God of love and peace" (2 Corinthians 13:11) is in our midst when we live in love and peace. God shares divine life with us by pouring out the Holy Spirit of grace, love, and holiness into the community of those who believe.

### Mystery Lived!

While we can never fully understand the mystery of God, we do receive clues to the nature of God through our *experiences* of God moving in our lives. And those experiences reveal to us that what the scriptures say is true. Little by little we realize with awe that God is indeed the Lord of the universe, creating and ordering all that is good. We recognize with humble gratitude the ways in which Christ's immense love has saved and brought us to life. Finally, we experience with joy the Holy Spirit alive in the community of believers, filling us with a love and peace that could only come from God.

The mystery of the Trinity is meant to be experienced, believed, and lived. And we ourselves are called to be living clues that reveal to others the mysterious love of the Most Holy Trinity. How are you being called to reveal the mystery of the Trinity more fully in your life?
