From the Tee Box

A Weekly Letter from Our Clergy
The Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 15th, 2009

Dear Friends:



WOW! is all I can say! Last Wednesday night we had 145 participants present for the first of our 6 adult ed classes! Father Jamin presented an introduction to the bible, and, despite, the extremely cold weather, pretty much everyone who signed up attended. First of all, let me thank Father Jamin for his hard work and excellent presentation. Also, let me say thanks to all of you for taking the time to come out. I was speaking with another priest of our diocese on the phone earlier today, and his reaction was, *“that surely is a great testimony to the people of your community!”* I could not agree more. Thanks again. I hope you all can join us this coming Wednesday for session number 2.

Speaking of session #2, it's entitled, ***“Generation What?! Trends in U.S. Culture Since 1900.”*** The reason it's called *“Generation What?!”* is simple. From 1900 until the late 60's and early 70's, the changes in our society were more clear and distinct and didn't seem to take place as abruptly as they do now. Since the rise of the digital age (over the last 20 years, especially) things seem to evolve more quickly. This is mainly due to the fact that we're so electronically connected to one another and to the rest of the world. The fact that there have been some shifts in moral and political thinking, changes in the structure and challenges of the average family, and the number of people who formally choose to belong to a formalized religion is not that surprising. After all, similar changes have taken place before. But the digital age of communication has intensified this entire experience. O.K., Father Trey, get to the point. The point is, that, because of all of this, it's really hard to label any one generation with any one name. The word *“What?!”* in the title expresses the fast, ever-evolving, at-the-speed-of-light quality of the world in which we are living.

In our next session, this coming Wednesday night, we will have a little fun with tracing and comparing some of the cultural changes throughout our history, but we will also look at some really hard-hitting and

important questions, such as:

1. What are the benefits and risks of technology?
2. Is there a connection between teenage cell phone use and depression?
3. Between video gaming and aggressive behavior?
4. Between early, in appropriate sexual acting out and the content of television programming?

And the most important question of all: ***if we as families, couples, and individuals want to maintain a healthy balance between technology and faith life, family life, and good health, then what are the resources available to us?***

There will be some fun interaction between the different generations present at this session. So, try to take the time to come out for a crash course in modern day culture. Again, babysitting is still available, but please call the church office to sign up for it. Thanks very much.
