A Weekly Note From Our Clergy

May 30th and 31st, 2009

The Feast of Pentecost



Dear Friends:

Lots to talk about this week. I don't mean to ramble on, but "the clock's a-runnin'," as they say. For starters, Father Jamin is in Washington, DC. He starts class in canon law this Monday. Please keep him in your prayers. I'm sure we haven't heard the last of him. And, of course, that's a good thing. Secondly, I went last week to Saint Jude Parish in Baton Rouge to meet the staff and tour the facilities. It was a really nice experience. Although things will be very different there, I am confident that everything you all have taught me will come in handy. Saint Jude has 2,300 families and a school with about 600 students (preschool through eighth grade.) According to the current pastor, Father David Allen, the staff consists of about 16 to 18 people, counting the 2 permanent deacons who serve there. The priests' residence is off-site, located directly across the street from the parish office. I'm really glad about that. In my entire 21 years of priesthood, I have never lived off-site from the office. I really think this will help with a healthy lifestyle. The rectory itself has a nice, fenced-in yard, perfect for my nieces and nephews to run around in and play safely, as well as a work-out room just off of the garage. Now all I have to do is recommit myself to actually exercising! The staff also includes a religious (Dominican) sister (Sr. Mary Ann Culotta, OP). I am very excited about the opportunity to minister with someone who serves in religious life. Other than the fact that daily Mass is at 6:15am each day, I can already see that the most difficult adjustment of all will no doubt be THE TRAFFIC! Just to turn out of the office driveway onto Highland Road took at least 10 minutes. And Father David and Father Chris said that wasn't long at all! So, to all of you who drive into B.R. each day for work, I already feel your pain. (Smile.) As difficult as it will be for me to say "goodbye," I am looking forward to the opportunity to do so. On the front cover of this bulletin, you will notice 2 dates for a farewell reception, one at Saint Philomena and one here at Saint Anne. If you can stop by for either one of those, I would really welcome the chance to visit with you. Lastly, I went down to New Orleans this past week to have supper with my backpacking partner, Ryan, and map out our trip to Utah. We're leaving on June 8. The part of our trip that excites me the most is our 3 day canoe trip down the Green River. We will be stopping along the way for 2 nights of

camping in 2 different locations. I'm really excited about seeing yet another one of our 50 beautiful States! Lastly, while I had mentioned this in the bulletin a couple of times (and also at our last adult ed session), many of you may not realize that plans are underway to do the final "hurricane restoration work" inside Assumption Church. Throughout this past year, especially since the storm, our Finance Council, Father Jamin, and I had met to discuss ways that all of us could work more closely together in the area of finances. While our 2 parishes (St. Anne and Assumption) maintain 2 sets of bank accounts and 2 sets of books, it was the unanimous consensus of the Council that, in certain cases when the need arises, we would rely on finances from both churches to help out, regardless of where the repair needed to be done. We will not do this for every need. We will weigh the larger needs as they arise and decide whether or not that need should be a combined effort. With this approach, we will continue to work together to help maintain all 3 of our churches: St. Anne, Assumption, and Immaculate Conception Chapel. We are, in fact, at the same time reviewing bids to do some repair work on the chapel as well. We have accepted a bid from Naquin Contractors for the work on Assumption and have kept Father Joel (our pastor to be) up to date on the progress. All that awaits us now is a copy of the resolution from the Diocese for us to sign. This resolution is, in essence, our permission to proceed with the work when the cost is above a certain amount, and is also a statement of our "in-house" agreement to proceed. The total cost of this project will be \$52,000 and will be shared 50/50 by St. Anne and Assumption. This decision is based on the reality that, while we are legally 2 separate church parishes, we are, in fact, 1 family, and many of our parishioners attend Mass at both churches and rely on all of our facilities. If you would like any further explanation regarding the process that led to this point, please feel free to contact me at any time.
